Youth Evaluation and Treatment Centers (YETC) is a 501 (c)3 not for profit agency. Our goal is to nurture our troubled youth back to health, guide them in making better choices, teach them positive behaviors, heal emotional wounds and assist them in leading healthier lives and achieving their personal best.

PROGRAMS & SERVICES

OUTPATIENT

Individual and family centered therapy for youth and their families who are experiencing a range of emotional, behavioral and substance abuse problems. This program consists of a staff of therapists, case managers, family support partners and coordinators.

Services include:

- Child & Family Team Facilitation
- Psychiatric services
- In home and family support
- Respite care
- Behavior coaching
- Case Management
- Individual, group and family therapy
- Multi-family support groups

INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT (IOPSA)

Formal 12-week curriculum with ongoing individual/family support designed for youth (Co-Ed ages 13-17) with serious substance abuse problems. Skilled staff addresses personal, social and family concerns that may contribute to the cycle of addiction.

Services include:

- Education and information on substance abuse issues
- Strength based social and life skills enhancement
- Recovery activities to support a substance free lifestyle
- Development of informal support network

PREVENTION

School and community based education/ training program that reaches children ages 5-13. Our prevention specialists work to build resiliency skills such as empathy, anger management and impulse control which reduce the antisocial behaviors that lead to aggression, violence and delinquency among youth.

Services include:

- Second Step Violence Prevention
- Project Alert Substance Abuse Prevention

PROJECT NEXT STEP

Project Next Step (PNS) is a family and community centered intervention designed to enhance the stability and integrity of the family by keeping or returning the child to the home. Project Next Step improves family performance, system independence, and personal responsibility by working with the family. Services are provided in the home and community for children ages 7-17.

Direct Services include:

- Parenting Skills
- Conflict Resolution
- Communication Skills
- Behavior Management
- Problem Solving
- Respite
- Daily Living Support
- Crisis Intervention
- Independent Living Skills
- Advocacy
- Informal Network Development
- Education Support

PNS partners with families, provider network organizations, stakeholders, and the community to provide quality services in a community based and family centered manner.
